Courses may be certified for Independent Study if your school is accredited and conforms with the criteria outlined in the Code of Federal Regulation 21.4267 (b):

It is a prescribed course; interaction exists between the student and regular faculty; and it is offered when there is no regular scheduled classroom session. It is not a cooperative or correspondence course; it is not a student teaching or flight training course and it does not apply to a graduate level thesis.

These courses must be listed in your college catalog, are an integral part of the student's program and credit earned apply to the students degree objective. Credit hours should be properly identified on the student's Enrollment Certification VA Form 22-1999. Your school must be able to document that these courses meet the requirements of the law.

A copy of this letter, your 2005-2006 Center Catalog and supporting documentation have been forwarded to the Department of Veterans Affairs for their information and appropriate action.

The authority for and conditions of this approval are in accordance with the provisions of Code of Federal Regulation 21.4253 as accredited courses.
