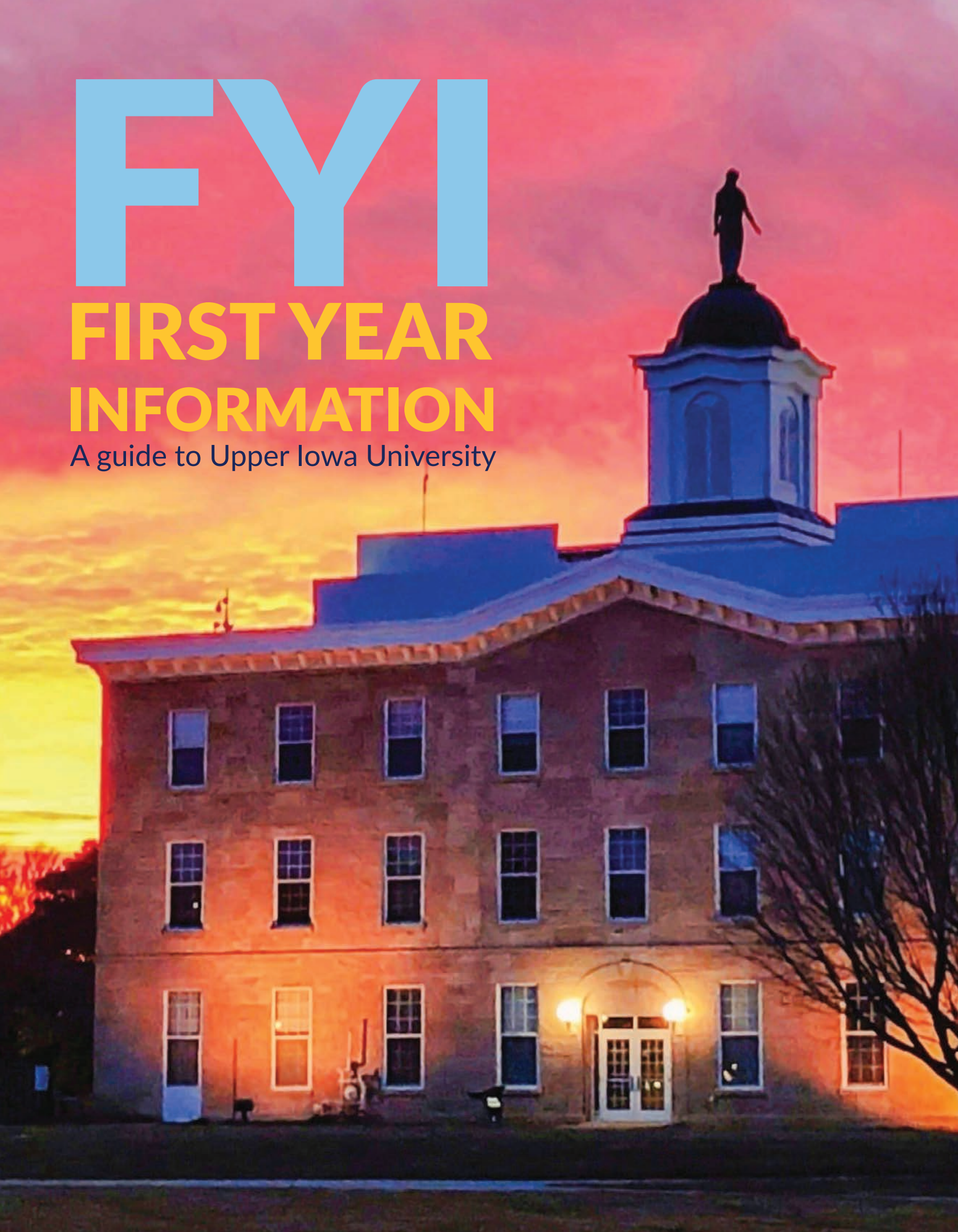
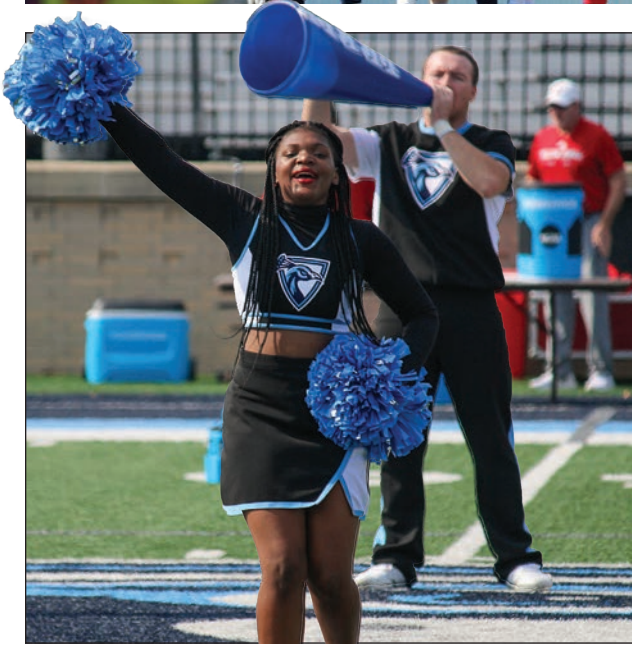

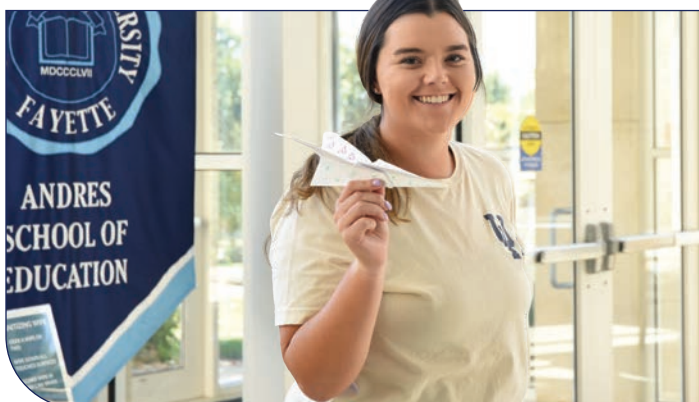

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

ACADEMIC CALENDAR

At UIU Fayette Campus, the academic year is divided into three major components: fall semester, spring semester and summer semester.

REGISTERING FOR CLASSES

During OAR (Orientation, Advising and Registration) Day, a faculty/staff member will assist you in registering for Sessions 1 and 2 through myUIU. Please note the faculty/staff member you meet with at OAR Day may or may not be your assigned academic advisor. For continuing semesters, you will meet with your assigned academic advisor. The advisor will approve courses selected on myUIU or help you add/drop courses.

COURSE LOAD PER SEMESTER

The minimum course load for full-time enrollment is 12 credit hours per semester (usually six credit hours per session). The minimum is especially important for those students who intend to obtain financial aid or participate in intercollegiate athletics. The Fayette full-time course load is between 12-18 credits each semester. Most students should plan to carry a minimum of 30 semester credits during the entire academic year if they are planning to graduate in four years. A minimum of 120 credit hours is needed to graduate.

All entering first-year students will register for 12-18 credits during their OAR Day. First Year Seminar at UIU is a course that transitions students to higher education and prepares them for their academic journey through self-exploration, reflection, and critical thinking. It is an expectation that all first-time, full-time students take FYS during their first semester of enrollment.

A face-to-face learning experience reinforces relationships, accountability and develops a stronger sense of community. Fayette Campus students are encouraged to take a *minimum* of two face-to-face classes per semester. Best practice is that students will have (at least) one face-to-face class per session.

CLASS SCHEDULING

There are seven time periods for course offerings during the day. Courses begin at:

8:00 a.m. 10:50 a.m. 1:05 p.m. 3:40 p.m.
9:25 a.m. 12:50 p.m. 2:15 p.m.

There are two basic course schedules. The most common courses meet four days a week (Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday) for 75 minutes each day. Other courses meet five days a week for 60 minutes each day.

SELECTING COURSES

Your ability to choose between different courses depends on three factors:

First, there are limits on the number of sections of courses that can be offered and on the number of students in any course. Courses do “close” when the number of registered students reaches the maximum number allowed in a course. You cannot register for a closed course.

Second, entering freshmen are generally limited to taking courses numbered less than 200. When you plan a schedule before meeting with your advisor, it is wise to select a few alternate courses in case the first choice is unavailable.

Third, your major area will determine the amount of choices you have on OAR Day. Certain majors require a specific core and/or sequence of courses. Therefore, you will have less freedom in choosing your courses.

WHAT CAN I DO IF A COURSE I WANT TO TAKE IS CLOSED?

Consult with your academic advisor concerning your options.

ARE THERE ANY GENERAL SUGGESTIONS ON WHICH COURSES I SHOULD TAKE?

For the first semester, first-year students typically register for courses that will fulfill the Peacock Professional Experience requirements. Transfer students register for courses that are listed on their advising worksheet. Your academic advisor is the best source for suggestions based on your particular circumstances.

PEACOCK PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENTS

These are courses (30 semester credit hours) all students must take to ensure they are well prepared to meet today’s rapidly changing environment of technological developments and the diverse people working to build a better future for all humanity.

While these courses may be taken at any point, a general suggestion is to complete as many as soon as possible given your particular circumstances.

Transfer students might have met some or all of these requirements through the successful completion of courses at their previous institutions. Transfer students should consult with their academic advisor concerning which requirements they have remaining.

COURSE NUMBERING SYSTEM

The course numbers denote the class level for which courses are intended. Courses numbered below 100 are designed to assist students in learning basic foundations. Those numbered 100-199 are designed for freshmen, 200-299 for sophomores, 300-399 for juniors, and 400-499 for seniors. Courses numbered below 100 do not count toward the 120 credits required for graduation.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Refer to the UIU Catalog for descriptions of courses.

READING THE COURSE SCHEDULE

The course schedule is available on myUIU or the UIU website at: uiu.edu/locations/fayette. Courses are listed alphabetically by department. On every page, there are several columns:

Course/Title: The first item is the abbreviation of the department followed by a 3-5 digit course number (the next four digits are for registration purposes). To the right of this line is the title of the course.

Cap: This is the maximum number of students allowed to register for the course.

Credits: This number is the semester credit hours for the course.

Days: The days of the week the course meets. For a 3-credit course, there are usually two options: every day (MTWRF) and four days a week (MTRF).

Beg. Time: The time when the course period starts.

End Time: The time when the course period ends.

Location: 05 designates a course offered face-to-face at Fayette Campus.

Bldg./Room: Where the course meets (building and room number).

Instructor(s): The name of the instructor.

Comments: Special instructions for some courses.

Credits earned by taking courses numbered below 100 are not counted toward the 120 credits needed to graduate, but they are counted toward your full-time status of 12-18 credits. First-year students may also count these courses for athletic eligibility credits. Like all courses, the GPA earned in these courses calculate into your cumulative GPA.

HOW CAN I CHANGE MY COURSE REGISTRATION?

You can alter your schedule with your advisor's permission. You have until the **third** day of each session to **add** a course and until the end of the fifth week of the session to withdraw from a course.

WHAT IF I HAVE A LEARNING DISABILITY?

The University will make appropriate and reasonable accommodations for those students who report a disability and provide appropriate documentation (see page 29).

ANY FINAL SUGGESTIONS TO AID ME IN REGISTERING?

CAREFULLY read and study all materials sent to you by UIU. COME PREPARED to participate fully with your academic advisor in the registration process. DO NOT hesitate to ask questions.

FINANCIAL SERVICES

STUDENT FINANCIAL SERVICES

Financial Aid and Student Accounts encompass Student Financial Services. Together, our staff helps parents and students understand the costs associated with an Upper Iowa University education, and to find means to meet these costs.

Through federal, state and institutional financial aid programs, as well as a variety of educational loan options and a payment plan program, we help families manage the cost of a quality education. Whether you make lump sum payments now or spread payments out over several months, we strive to provide the services needed to make Upper Iowa University a financial reality for our students.

FINANCIAL AID

The first step to applying for federal student aid is completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The 2026-27 FAFSA was made available for submission on October 1, 2025. Students are required to report income information from the 2024 tax year. The FAFSA is a FREE application and can be completed and submitted at the link below: <https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fasfa>.

If you need any assistance in completing the FAFSA, please contact our office to discuss questions or schedule an appointment. The FAFSA should be completed for each year that you would like to receive financial aid.

After filing your FAFSA, you will receive a FAFSA Submission Summary (FSS) listing the information from your FAFSA. Your FSS also lists your Student Aid Index (SAI), which is used to determine your eligibility for need-based aid. Please review your FSS for accuracy and make any necessary corrections online. If your family's financial situation changes after you submit your FAFSA, you may request a review of your eligibility by contacting the Financial Aid Office.

Check your myUIU and UIU email. Any correspondence related to your financial aid offer notification will be conducted via your UIU email account and myUIU.

NET PARTNER

The Financial Aid Office utilizes the Net Partner Portal system to communicate with students regarding their financial aid files and to provide students with updates. Net Partner is separate from the myUIU system and is specifically used for Financial Aid purposes. Net Partner can be accessed using your student ID by navigating to uiu.edu/financialaid, and selecting the Net Partner button on the right side of the page.

Financial Aid notifications, general information and requested documents needed by the Financial Aid Office are posted on Net Partner. Email notifications are sent to a student's UIU email address when information is needed. Students are ultimately responsible for managing their Net Partner document requirements and completing their financial aid files to receive aid.

Students requiring assistance with gaining access to Net Partner or completing document requirements through Net Partner, should contact our office for personalized service.

Refunds

Refunds are processed through BankMobile/BTMX. A code will be emailed to activate your refund preference. All students must set this up so they are ready to receive a refund if one is ever issued. Go to refundselection.com to complete setup.

Students: Is a parent, guardian, or someone else helping with your bill? Add them to your Meadow Pay account so they can view and pay your bill.

Steps to add parent or guardian to account:

1. Log in to Meadow Pay via www.pay.uiu.edu.
2. Grant access to the person (or people) who are helping you pay.
3. They'll get an email invitation to accept access to your bills.

TEXTBOOKS

Textbooks are sold through the Upper Iowa University Virtual Bookstore, under the management of BNC/MBS Direct.

HOW DO I FIND MY TEXTBOOKS?

There are two ways to locate your required textbooks.

1. After you have registered for classes and your registration has been approved, logon to myUIU.
 - Click the Academics Tab.
 - Click BNC Course Link (Bookstore) on the left side of the screen.
 - Click the Bookstore button to be taken to your shopping cart at the bookstore.

All of your required books will be listed, giving you the option to purchase new or used, or rent new or used publications when available. In some instances, digital books will also be available. Please see the Virtual Bookstore brochure within your OAR Day materials for more information on digital textbooks.

2. Visit the bookstore website at bncvirtual.com/uiu.
 - Click "Let's Get Started."
 - Have your schedule readily available and choose your session, location/program, course and section.
 - Repeat this step for each remaining class.
 - From here you will be able to view your required materials.

HOW DOES RENTING WORK?

A majority of textbooks are available to be rented in new and used condition. All rentals are due seven days after the last day of class. When returning a textbook, simply place the prepaid shipping label on your return box and drop off at the Campus mail room.

WHAT IS A DIGITAL TEXTBOOK?

Digital textbooks are available for many classes. These books include the same information as a physical textbook and can be accessed on a variety of mobile platforms.

HOW CAN I PAY FOR MY TEXTBOOKS?

Textbook payment options include check, credit/debit card, PayPal, money order or by student account. If a student's total financial aid award amount for the semester exceeds all institutional charges on the student's account (including, but not limited to tuition, fees, Campus housing and meals) the student would receive a book voucher. Students who do not have an excess of funds after all institutional charges are covered will not be eligible for a book charge and will have to pay using one of the other methods. It is advised to purchase both Session 1 and Session 2 books at the beginning of the semester to ensure the overage covers those expenses.

WHEN CAN I PURCHASE/RENT TEXTBOOKS AND HOW QUICKLY WILL THEY ARRIVE?

Textbooks can be ordered at any point following registration. All orders over \$49 include free standard shipping and will typically arrive in 3-4 business days.

Expedited shipping will be fulfilled within one business day.

WHEN DO I NEED TO HAVE MY BOOKS?

Instructors request that students have the books before classes start.

CAN I SELL MY BOOKS BACK WHEN DONE WITH THE CLASS?

HOW DO I GET READY FOR COLLEGE?

STEP 1

Attend an OAR Day. The best you can do is to keep attentive and focused on your OAR Day. Your life will be easier on the first day of classes because much of the “busy-work” can be completed on your OAR Day.



STEP 2

Prepare your mind for college. You are not in high school any more. You are on your own for the most part and you should be prepared for a lot of change. Not only will you “finally” have some freedom, you will also gain MUCH responsibility. No one will be waking you up for school anymore and you will be doing your own laundry! Here are some of the “little” things that will help you be ready for your next step in life.



To be successful at college (and in life) you need to be focused on priorities. Be sure to enjoy your college experience but don't forget this experience is costing you or your parents a lot of money. Stay focused and

don't waste this investment. Set your goals and find a social balance that works best for you.

Get used to getting up early. Classes begin as early as 8 a.m. and athletic practices begin as early as 5:30 a.m. Don't spend your entire summer sleeping in. Adjust your body's internal clock to get up at a proper time depending upon your schedule.

Determine how much sleep you need. It may be fun and exciting to stay up all night, but lack of sleep can affect your performance academically, physically and emotionally.

Speak with your parents about finances. You may not have a clear understanding of how much money you will need at this point. Work together to prepare an initial budget and discuss plans for traveling home on breaks.

Learn a few things from home. You may or may not have a lot of chores to do at home. Be ready to take care of yourself before coming to Campus. Know how to do laundry, cook meals, change a light bulb, clean house, maintain a car, balance a checkbook, etc. If there are things you want to learn about, ask!

STEP 3

Get ready to move! If you plan on living in the University's residence halls, you need to think about what to pack! Don't think you have to bring EVERYTHING from home – it just won't fit! Refer to the list on page 12 to determine what is most necessary. Be sure to include special items that will make you feel at home at UIU. You can always bring more “stuff” later!

DINING SERVICES

YOUR MEAL CARD

Your student ID card is required for admittance to the Servery for all meals. There will be no admittance without a current student ID card. In the event of a missing ID card, please stop by Student Life. It is important to replace missing ID cards immediately for security reasons. A fee is imposed for the reissuance of lost, damaged or stolen ID cards.

RESIDENCE HALL MEAL PLANS

A resident dining meal plan is mandatory for all residential students during the academic school sessions. There are no exceptions or appeals. The resident dining program includes the following:

Peacock Platinum (*per semester*)

- All Access to Servery, 10 guest meals and \$800 Dining Dollars

Peacock Blue (*per semester*)

- All Access to Servery, 10 guest meals and \$200 Dining Dollars

Peacock Basic (*per semester*)

- Only for students in Hofmaster, Lee Tower, and off campus
- 100 Servery meals, 10 guest meals and \$500 Dining Dollars

Dining Dollars can be used in the Café, located in the Student Center, at most concession stands on the Fayette Campus, Baked Vending machine located in the Rec. Center, and at Pete's Bar and Grill, located in downtown Fayette.

COMMUTER STUDENTS

Commuters are welcome to purchase any residential plan but also have the choice to purchase an 80 block plan. This plan has 80 meals available to use in the Servery and \$50 in Dining Dollars per semester. This plan can be requested on [myUIU>Academics>Student Life>Commuter Meal Plan Request Form](#).

FERPA PERMISSIONS

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) is a federal law that protects the privacy of student education records. For a parent, guardian or other person to view information about a student, the student must grant permissions to each person by completing a form located under “Student Forms” on the “Academics” tab on myUIU. The student must select “Set FERPA Permissions” to complete the form.

Permission categories include information relating to course schedule, financial information, academic information/grades, account holds and residence life information. The student may select different permissions for each of these categories. Please note that permissions do not take effect right away. The University must process the request and the person receiving permissions will receive an email when his or her account is ready.

PEER MENTOR PROGRAM

The Peer Mentor Program connects experienced students with peers who are looking for guidance, support, and a friendly connection on campus. Whether you're interested in sharing your experiences and helping others succeed, or you're looking for advice and support as you navigate college life, the Peer Mentor Program is a great opportunity to build meaningful relationships and strengthen our campus community. Students interested in participating as a mentor or mentee can apply through the Student Life forms on their myUIU portal. We encourage anyone interested to sign up and be part of this supportive and rewarding program!

PARKING ON CAMPUS

Students who park a motor vehicle on Campus must purchase a parking permit. The fee for a parking permit is \$100. You may purchase a parking permit online or in person at the Student Life Front Desk, available Monday - Thursday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Student Life accepts cash or checks. If paying online, only a credit/debit card can be used. The parking registration form, as well as an option to purchase a parking permit online can be found at uiu.edu/experience/parking-on-campus.

The parking permit must be in place when parked in a University parking lot or you may receive a parking violation.

Where to Park: Parking lots are labeled for permit parking and visitor parking. Students living in a residence hall should park in lots labeled “R.” Commuting students are to park in lots labeled with a “C.”

Where NOT to park: Students, faculty and staff of the Fayette Campus are NOT permitted to park in visitor parking lots. Be sure to look for signage as well as reading the Parking Rules and Regulations (found at myUIU).

*The City of Fayette does not allow vehicles to be parked on city streets overnight.

Any student, faculty or staff member parked in a visitor lot will be ticketed (\$10-\$50). Another area that is restricted from parking is a loading area located just north of Garbee Hall or near garbage receptacles. Anyone parking in these areas will be ticketed (\$50) or towed without notice.

STUDENT EMPLOYMENT

There are two types of UIU student workers – Federal Work Study (FWS) and UIU funded. Students eligible for Federal Work Study should visit the Financial Aid Office in the Student Enrollment Center (Liberal Arts, First Floor) for additional information. On-campus student employment options can be found on Handshake. Visit Handshake (uiu.joinhandshake.com/login) to activate your student account and browse available openings. Connect with UIU's Office of Career Development for additional on or off-campus and local employment options that might not be posted.

Once a student has obtained a position, a student worker contract will be issued. If this is the first position the student has held at UIU, the student must complete new hire paperwork. New hire paperwork consists of Form I-9, confidentiality statement, direct deposit authorization form and Federal/State W-4 forms.

New student workers are unable to begin work until the contract and required paperwork have been completed and submitted to the HR Specialist (Human Resources Office, Alexander Dickman, 1st floor).

When completing the Form I-9, students must present a combination of original documentation that establishes their identity and employment authorization. These identification documents are referred to as List A, List B and List C documents. Below is a list of acceptable documents:

- U.S. Passport

- Alien Registration Receipt Card
- Foreign Passport

International Students: In addition to the above described hiring process, international students may be required to comply with applicable U.S. federal government regulations. International students should contact the International Services Coordinator for more details and if they need to obtain a Social Security card.

CABLE AND INTERNET

Internet hookups are available in every residence hall room.

Students are to bring their own computer. TV's are available to use in all common areas.

Students are provided with an Educational Internet Package for internet access to their residence hall room at no cost. For enhanced usage, Entertainment and Gaming packages are available for an additional cost (see page 22).

TRANSPORTATION TO UIU

Students making flight or bus arrangements are asked to plan their arrival into the Cedar Rapids Airport or Iowa City or Coralville bus stations. Students needing transportation must sign up for a shuttle via uiu.edu/shuttle or via the QR codes posted around campus. For planning purposes, reservations are required via the registration form and are accepted until one week prior to the transportation date. UIU's shuttle transportation is available only on the published dates.

Students needing transportation outside of the published dates/times should make arrangements with external shuttle vendors. Please plan your travel to and from Fayette around the published times.

TUTOR & WRITING CENTER

The Tutor Center is housed in Student Center Room 217. The space has been created for an atmosphere conducive to academic productivity, group work sessions, one-on-one consultations or independent work.

The Center includes one full-time staff director, trained peer tutors and writing consultants. In addition to the staff, there are several academic resources available both in the physical center and online, none of which require any cost to students.

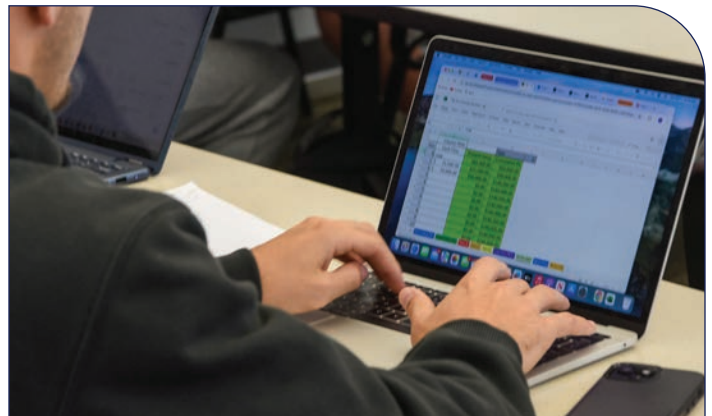

LIBRARY SERVICES

HENDERSON-WILDER LIBRARY

Henderson-Wilder Library, located on the Fayette campus, is a unique merger of a 1901 Carnegie library and a 1960s library addition creating over 4000 square feet of collection and study space. The building contains over 94,000 books, journals, and multimedia materials across three floors and is home to the University Archives. The UIU Archives preserves and promotes the history of the University and our community. History is highlighted through primary source materials such as images, stories, artifacts, and documents from when Upper Iowa University opened its doors in January 1857 to today. Select materials are digitized and made available online through the archive's website. If there are items you would like to donate, or stories you would like to share, please contact the library at archives@uiu.edu.

The Library supports UIU undergraduate and graduate academic programs by providing a full range of information resources and services that encourage learning, study, research, and collaboration. The library provides access to collections, both in print and online, that meet the curricular, research, and collaborative needs of the total university. Library databases, research guides by subject, and additional electronic access to e-book collections and thousands of full-text journals, references, newspapers, maps, etc. are available via the library website. All subscription-based databases may be accessed with the student's login credentials at anytime and anywhere; thus, providing library resources for UIU's global community.

Henderson-Wilder Library provides a pleasant, quiet study environment, fun, engaging resources, and activities. Its hours adjust each session (every eight

weeks) to best support our students' needs. Please visit the library's website for the most up-to-date hours. Information Literacy Sessions are available upon request for classes and individuals to learn how to use library resources. As a learning resource center, the library houses private and group study rooms, an Audio-Visual Room with a computer, video player, and projector in a classroom setting, the Kinney Room with an extensive collection of children's and young adult books, several computer docking stations and computer stations, a multimedia creation computer station with adobe suite, and an Education Curriculum Resource library. As a federal depository, United States government documents are freely available in print and online. The library is home to the Sensory Room, provided by Student Accessibility Services, and the Learning, Curiosity, and Acceptance Resource Room, provided by the Counseling Office. Laminating services are available at .08 cents per running inch with a max width of 25 inches. Through the Iowa GEER technology grant, UIU students enrolled at an Iowa location or an online student living in Iowa may check out a laptop for one term or an iPad for one session. Supplies are limited and distributed on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Henderson-Wilder Library participates in many InterLibrary Loan (ILL) networks and resource-sharing consortiums, enabling library users to obtain most published and circulating material that is not owned by UIU at no cost to the UIU community. Interlibrary loan services are available to UIU faculty, staff, and students.

RESIDENCE LIFE

GARBEE HALL COMPLEX

Garbee Hall is the primary living area for residence hall students. Each floor contains 36 rooms, a laundry room and a community bathroom. A community kitchen is available for student use in the lower level lobby.

All rooms are designed for two students. Rooms measure 12' x 15' and contain 2 desks, 2 beds, 2 wardrobes, 2 dressers, 2 desk chairs and 2 bookshelf units.

SOUTH VILLAGE 1, 2 AND 3

South Village 1 is located just south of Lee Tower. This suite-style building consists of 24 suites. The size and occupancy of these suites varies from a single room with a private bathroom to a 3, 4, 5 or 6 person suite. Each suite has a bathroom, living room and air conditioning. Free laundry facilities, lounge area and community kitchen are available on each floor.

Bedrooms are equipped with a bed, dresser, desk, desk chair and built-in closets for each resident. Students are able to apply in the spring for the following year.

South Village 2 is located west of South Village 1. This suite-style building consists of 25 suites. The size and occupancy of these suites varies from a single room with a private bathroom to a 3, 4, 5 or 6 person suite. The amenities of South Village 2 resembles South Village 1 with the exception that each suite has their own kitchenette (refrigerator, microwave and sink).

South Village 3 is located west of Lee Tower. This suite-style building consists of 28 suites. The size and occupancy of these suites varies from a single room with a private bathroom to a 3 and 4 person suite. The amenities of South Village 3 resembles South Village 1 with the exception that each suite has their own kitchenette (refrigerator, microwave and sink).

Shower curtains will not be provided in South Village bathrooms. Students are responsible for their own supply of toilet paper.

All South Village common areas are provided with a chair, loveseat, side table and TV stand.

LEE TOWER SUITES

Lee Tower is comprised of 6 suites with 2 suites per floor and is capable of housing up to 47 students. Each suite contains 4 bedrooms (2 students per bedroom), 2 bathrooms, a kitchen and living room area. Each suite is equipped with full kitchen, including a stove, refrigerator, microwave and dishwasher. Each floor shares a laundry facility.

Lee Tower Apartments are designed for upper-class students who are ready for a more independent lifestyle. Students are able to apply in the spring for the following year. Each bedroom contains 2 beds, 2 dressers, 2 movable desks with a desk light and bookshelf, 2 desk chairs and 2 built-in closets.

Shower curtains will not be provided in Lee Tower bathrooms. Students are responsible for their own supply of toilet paper.

HOFFMASTER SUITES

Hoffmaster offers 2- and 3-bedroom apartment, some apartments have large living rooms while some have a much smaller living room, each apartment has a full kitchen with large fridge, and stove. Hoffmaster only has 16 spaces for residences. These residences are master program students, depending on demand it may be open to transfer students. Each room at minimum has 1 bed (Twin XL) , 1 desk, 1 dresser. The washer and dryers are located on the first floor. There are two entrances into the apartments, one being inside through a stairwell and the other being external to the building.

ALL RESIDENCE HALL ROOMS HAVE:

Wireless internet access: Students are to bring their own computer for use in their residence hall room. The above mentioned services are provided free of charge, unless otherwise noted. Air conditioning is provided in all residence hall rooms and suites.

No smoking, vaping, nicotine or tobacco. All residence hall rooms (as well as the entire Campus) have been designated as no smoking, vaping, nicotine, or tobacco.

X-Long Mattress: All residence hall rooms have an x-long mattress included with the bed. Dimensions of the mattress are Length: 80"; Width: 36"; Depth: 10".

STUDENT ACCESSIBILITY SERVICES

STUDENT ACCESSIBILITY SERVICES

Upper Iowa University Student Accessibility Services (UIUSAS) is committed to ensuring equal access to, and full participation in, educational and co-curricular activities to students with disabilities.

The University will make accommodations for only those students who report a disability and provide appropriate documentation. For appropriate accommodations to be made, documentation must be on file with the Office of Student Accessibility Services. Documentation is required to establish both the presence of a disability and the need for accommodations. IEP's or Section 504 Plans may or may not be sufficient. If not sufficient, further documentation from external sources, such as an evaluation by a licensed psychologist or doctor may be required. Documentation must support the requested accommodations. It is the student's responsibility to arrange and pay for all needed disability assessments.



THE PROCEDURE TO RECEIVE UIUSAS SERVICES IS AS FOLLOWS:

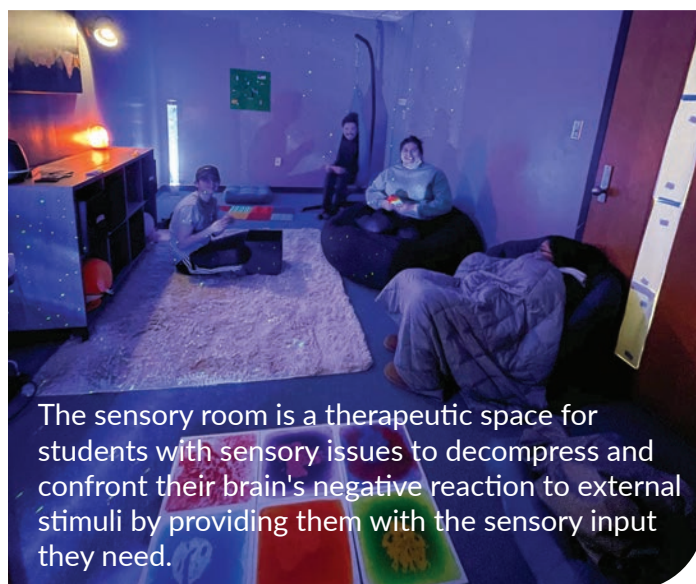
1. Student provides the appropriate documentation of a disability, an Accommodation application packet: <https://uiu.edu/wp-content/uploads/Student-Accessibility-Services-Application-Packet-1.pdf> (which includes the Voluntary Disclosure form), and a Release and Exchange of Information form to the director.
2. See the Student Accessibility Services Handbook for explanations of documentation. The handbook can be found online at <https://uiu.edu/experience/student-accessibility-services>.
3. A meeting will be held with the student and the Office of Student Accessibility Services to discuss the disclosed disability and provided documentation. A virtual or in-person meeting

will be scheduled with the director. An interview will be conducted during the meeting. The purpose of the interview is to provide the student with an opportunity to offer further historical information about their disability, the barriers the disability presents, and the student's requested accommodations. A reasonable accommodation plan for the upcoming session will be made during this meeting.

4. Accommodation letters will be sent electronically by the Office of Student Accessibility Services to the student, advisor and professors.
5. The student should bring all concerns regarding accommodations to the attention of the Office of Student Accessibility Services.
6. A request from the student is required at the beginning of each session, and for each class, in order for Student Accessibility Services to send notifications of accommodations. The student is responsible for requesting accommodations for each session from the director.

Services for students with disabilities are tailored to meet individual needs in order to comply with Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and the Americans with Disabilities Act Amendments Act of 2008.

TRANSPORTATION

UIU FREE SHUTTLE SERVICE

UIU provides a free shuttle service to UIU students to and from the Cedar Rapids Airport, Iowa City and Coralville bus stations on specific published dates. Shuttles are scheduled only at the beginning and end of the fall and spring semesters, and for the Thanksgiving break (November) and Spring Break (March). UIU does not offer shuttle service outside of the published dates and times.

Students may view scheduled shuttle trips and sign up for the free shuttle service by visiting uiu.edu/shuttle or via the QR codes posted around campus. For planning purposes, reservations are required via the registration form and are accepted until one week prior to the transportation date. UIU's shuttle transportation is available only on the published dates. Please arrive 10 minutes prior to the published time; the shuttle leaves promptly at the published time and must remain on schedule. Students who miss their scheduled shuttle may have the option to utilize the next scheduled shuttle, based on availability. In case of inclement weather, shuttles may be delayed until road conditions improve.

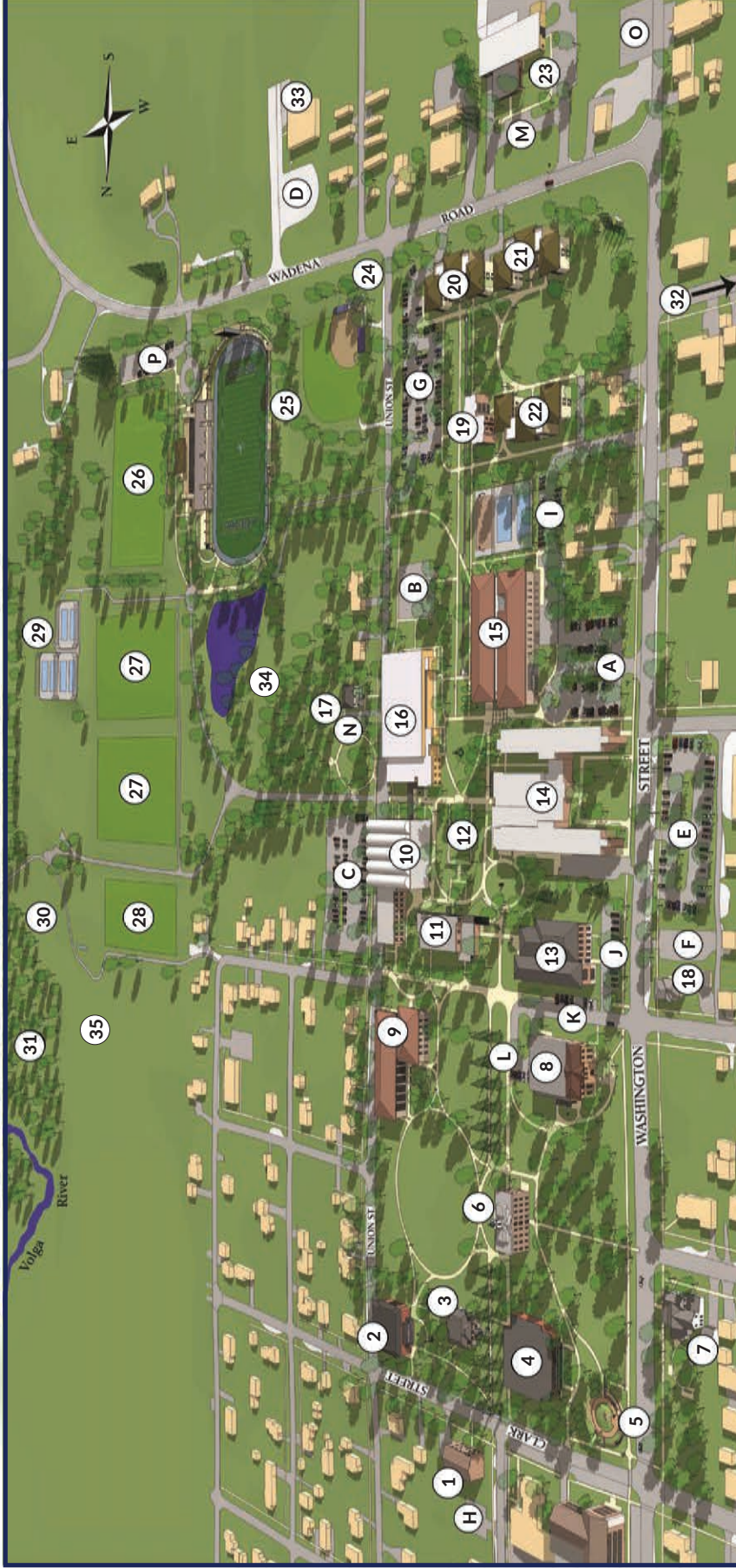

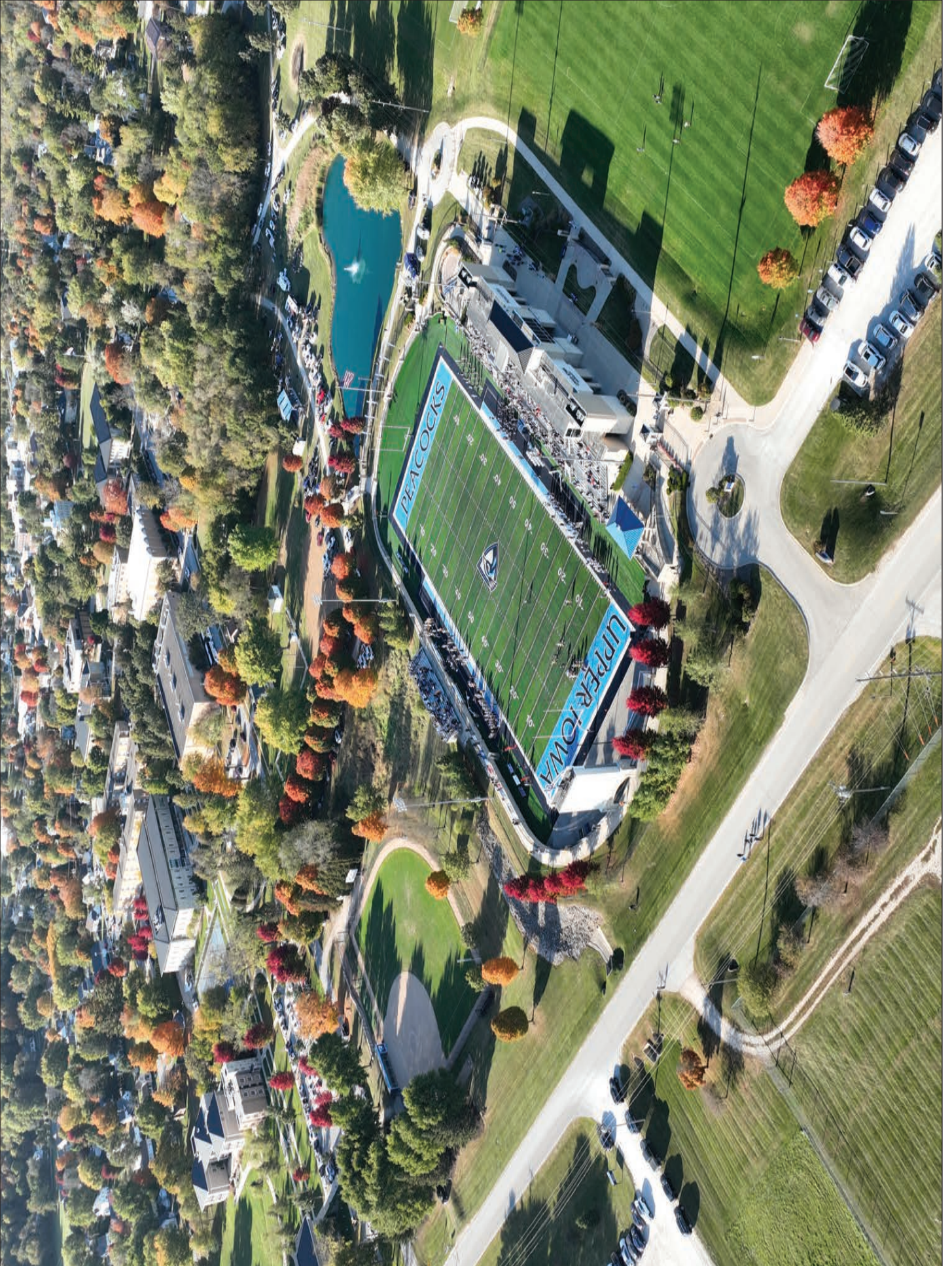

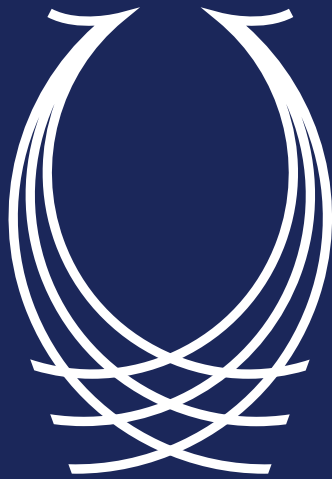
