Other transfer courses may be reviewed on a course-by-course basis.

Students who transfer to UIU with a completed Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree with an approved liberal arts core from Northeast Iowa Community College, will be considered to have fulfilled all Upper Iowa University general education requirements.

Lower division transfer work will not contribute to the upper division credit requirement at UIU.

Upper Iowa University may transfer up to 78 lower division college semester credits from accredited institutions for new students beginning Term I (August) 2004. A maximum of 78 semester credits may be transferred from community/technical colleges.

These 78 semester credits include:

- A. No more than nine semester credits from Exercise and Sport Studies (HPER) activity courses, including transcribed intercollegiate athletics.
- B. No credits from courses identified by Upper Iowa University as remedial or developmental (except for articulated ESL credits from partner institutions).
- C. No more than 30 semester credits from one-year occupational diploma programs.
